



Academic Snapshot – CBSE & Cambridge


The academic rhythm for both CBSE and Cambridge streams continued with precision and purpose through July and August. Courses across all grades were completed as scheduled, followed by focused revision plans and structured doubt-clearing sessions. Assessments for Grades 1 to 4 commenced, while Periodic Tests for Grades 1 to 12 (CBSE) and Primary to IGCSE L2 levels (Cambridge) were conducted with full momentum.

A noteworthy highlight was the Student Pre-Assessment SLC held on 5th July, which served as a valuable bridge between the students' academic progress so far and their readiness for the upcoming periodic assessments. It allowed parents and teachers to align on strategies for academic reinforcement. Revision approaches reflected the distinct assessment styles of each curriculum:

- **CBSE (Middle & High School):** Revision followed the structured format and marking schemes as per CBSE board guidelines.
- **Cambridge (Lower Secondary & IGCSE):** Past paper-based practice sessions familiarised students with the IGCSE exam pattern, ensuring readiness for international benchmarks.






